together and in the community


our adult Sunday school and our Bible study have opened up dimensions too seldom or not strongly enough stressed. While the Bible is indeed scripture, it is so much more.

The quarterly meeting of the Joy Mennonite Church Advisory Board will be held in Deer Creek at 7:00 p.m. on Friday, 19 March.


Bethel College Choir will bring us a musical evening program on Friday, 26 March. For information call (405) 799-7836 or 324-7644.
