The Neighborhood work day (clean-up day) on Saturday, 16 April, 1994 was a big success thanks to the hard working efforts of both the Lincoln Terrace neighbors and the volunteer workers of Joy Mennonite Church.

Then on 18 April a caravan of volunteers from Kansas arrived. We have begun to move the ship. We don't always know if we are making the right decisions, but then you can only guide a ship when it is moving. We believe we will need to think about setting some guidelines and establishing priorities. We invite your suggestions.

Perhaps if I tell you of my background it may help you understand our intentions. I grew up in an Amish family. I still treasure the kind of life I experienced in my home. Amish people work together, help each other, sometimes when there are special needs and sometimes just because there is something that needs to be done. When someone really needed help my father would say: "We are never too busy to help if someone has need."

Saturday, 16 April, the local volunteer crew oy Mennonite Church removed the old roof and aced the front section at the home of Sandra Daniels on 18th Street. Other workers removed dead trees and branches around the home of Cornelia Roach on 15th and around the home of Bob Underside in the 700 block on 20th.

The Caravan of volunteers from Kansas worked in the neighborhood west of Stiles. The caravan was made up of couples all over seventy years of age. We repaired two plumbing problems and partially reroofed a home and painted another home. We believe most of our volunteer work will be in the same area west of Stiles. We also want to be neighbors and be part of working not only when people are destitute but whenever we can participate to serve needs.

LAUGHING WITH ABRAHAM & SARAH

"What blows to Oklahoma from Kansas is not good," someone said, jokingly. The Laughing with Abraham and Sarah Caravan group from Newton, Kansas, hoped to prove this wrong as they did volunteer work through the Joy Mennonite Church in the Menno House where they were staying from April 18 to 24.

Six senior citizens came to Oklahoma City in a van, furnished by a like-minded couple, with hopes of making a difference in the

neighborhood.

Moses Mast, pastor of Joy, and his wife, Sadie, made arrangements and worked with the volunteers in the West 16th Street area. Shingling, plumbing, painting, cooking and home visitation have challenged Lester and Winifred Ewy, Ben and Leona Sawatzky, Pale and Elda Bachman, and Muriel Stackley who were excited about the venture and were laughing in the joy of service. Some of the group toured REST, a day shelter for the homeless, and volunteered in the clothing and laundry rooms.

The "Laughing with Sarah and Abraham" idea comes from a decision of the Mennonite General Conference at its last general session. As Abraham and Sarah, in the Genesis story from the Bible, laughed with disbelief at God's challenge to them, even so skeptical laughter could precede the venture in helping new or struggling

churches.

A Saturday craft day, open to anyone, including quilting and the making of banners, jewelry and other novelty items, was held at the Joy Mennonite Church building on the corner of Lincoln and NE 16th. The Sunday morning worship at the same location was conducted by the volunteer group.

Similar caravans have gone with volunteers to Pismo Beach, California, to the new Servant Community Church there, and to Miami, Florida, to the Miami Mennonite Fellowship Church. The next caravan group, again headed by the Ewys,

will go to Philadelphia, PA.


