for participating with the
conquering powers and
religious conversion is

another way to bring the conquered people under the

subjection of the dominant culture of the conqueror. It is also common for the conquerors to admit they did wrong after the conquered are sufficiently subdued as to be unable to resist anymore.

All of this may be true, and Mennonites too have sinned greatly in their participation with the conquering powers but it is not the whole truth. It is also true that a redemption story was shared and people were redeemed. Leaving people alone as if they did not exist is not the alternative only to participating with the conquering powers evangelize. Even now as we confess our sins of the past we must seek the understand true missionary effort or evangelism as common children of God

and a common people sharing the planet earth.

First, all cultures and people have fallen and need God's redemption. Second, only the redeemed from the sins of their culture can truly evangelize. Evangelism becomes, as someone has said, one beggar telling another beggar where the bread is. Evangelism is a redemption story that is shared, not a faith tradition to be propagated and imposed. We must share the gospel not only for the sake of the lost but for our own sake. We are like the alcoholic who, in helping another overcome their addiction are helping themselves overcome their own addiction. We must share in order to keep. Remember Jesus' words, "If you lose your life for others

you will find it, if you seek to save your life, you will lose it."

The Church picnic and business meeting are Sunday, May 3rd, at Ray Trent Park in Del City, after morning services!


The Church Campout!
